

## REDS

### 2005 Zinfandel, Leaping Lizard (Sonoma, CA)

If you just need a glass of wine & you want to keep it simple, then reach for this pleasant Zinfandel! Full of red & black fruits with aromas of cranberry, pomegranate, & strawberry, it has a beautiful deep color & a warm round finish. **8.00/24.00**

### 2005 Armador Carmenere, Odfjell (Maule Valley, Chili)

Velvety ripeness with black cherry fruit, followed by hints of cocoa, leather, & pleasant notes of spice. Definitely made to enjoy right now. This one goes great with the ribs! **8.00/24.00**

### Il Valpolicella Classico, Buglioni (Veneto, Italy)

A fun little wine made from a blend of Corvina, Corvinone, Rondinella, & Molinara grapes. You may not have heard of these grape varieties, but be daring & give it a try—it's so worth it. With intense aromas of cherry & delicate berry fruit, it's dry with a well balanced flavor, fresh & delicious. The name doesn't exactly roll off my tongue, but you can just ask for the Italian blend. **9.00/32.00**

### 2006 Cabernet Sauvignon, The Show (CA)

Big & bold with flavors of dried black cherries, jammy raspberry preserves, & layers of spice & sweet vanilla. This is a staff favorite—for fun people only please. **28.00**

### Premium Malbec, Alta Vista (Mendoza, Argentina)

An elegant wine with a bouquet that's concentrated & dense. It's filled with flavors of black raspberry, licorice & spice. The fruit is powerful, yet smooth on the palate & keeps unfolding for ages...revealing layers of savory berries & cocoa touched by notes of earthy minerality. **31.00**

### 2005 Generation Red, Hitching Post (Santa Barbara, CA)

I'm always in the mood for this wine when I'm kickin' back at home. Always consistent & yummy, it's a satisfying blend of Merlot, Cabernet, & Syrah—packed with berry fruits & notes of leather & earth. **34.00**

### 2006 C5 Zinfandel, Sidejob Cellars "Stefanie Vineyard"

(Dry Creek Valley, CA)  
A great wine that starts with heady blueberry & plum scents & hints of anise & vanilla. The intense fruity flavors have muscular tannins & racy acids with a powerful finish of cherry fruit & rough-hewn, tooth-sticking tannins. **48.00**

### 2005 Pinot Noir, Hitching Post St. Rita's Earth

(Santa Rita Hills, CA)  
a blend of 4 vineyards from Santa Rita Hills, it has dark fruits & an excellent structure with depth & intrigue. These people really know how to make a great Pinot Noir! **55.00**

### 2006 Pinot Noir, Roar "Santa Lucia Highlands"

(Santa Lucia Highlands, California)  
Spicy & smokey black cherry aromas with deep & layered black cherry flavors with smoky earth & spicy notes. It has a silky texture, good structure & balance with a long finish. A deep and complex Pinot that really represents the Santa Lucia Highlands terroir. It needs a few more years of maturing, but what the heck, throw caution to the wind & see what it tastes like now & then try it again in a few years. We'll probably still have some around (seeing as how we are a Rib Shack & all). **70.00**

### Sofia (187ml can)

A fun sparkling white wine with notes of apricot, orange blossoms, & pear—very refreshing, with a crisp finish in a pretty can & complete with its own straw. **7.50**

## WHITES

### 2007 Finco Monte Lindo Chardonnay, Alta Vista

(Mendoza, Argentina)  
A lovely Chardonnay with a touch of Torrontes grapes which give this medium bodied wine some delicate floral aromas. Steel fermentation allows the lively tropical fruits to come through on the palate. Crisp, clean, pretty, & delicious—it's easy to drink down a bottle or two. **7.00/21.00**

### 2007 Riesling, Rudi Wiest (Mosel River, Germany)

A great wine with your meal! It has a clean mineral quality, notes of apple & pear, & a good acidity & balance. We should all drink more Riesling! **7.50/22.00**

### 2006 Pinot Gris, Adelsheim (Oregon)

A superb balance of fruit & vibrant acidity; considered by many to be the benchmark of Oregon Pinot Gris! **28.00**

### 2007 Sauvignon Blanc, Brander (Santa Ynez Valley, CA)

A mouthful of vibrant key lime pie, papaya and pea blossoms carry along in a wash of acidity—nimble on its feet & very refreshing. My go to wine when I don't want to be irritated by disappointment—very Sauvignon Blanc. **28.00**

### 2006 Alto Adige Pinot Grigio, Terlano (Trentino, Italy)

Ok, I absolutely take back all the bad things I have said about Pinot Grigio. This one rocks my world! It's full of lovely melon & intense Macintosh apples...crisp & light on the palate with not so subtle hints of pineapple, round notes of orange zest & almond, & a lingering spicy tropical fruit finish. I want to take a bath in this stuff! **38.00**
